

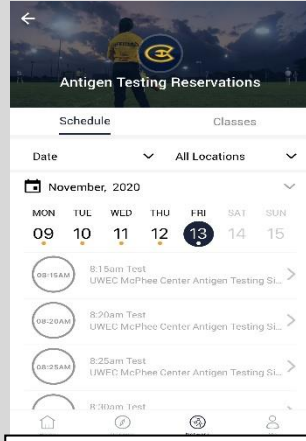
My Life as a UWEC Freshman During the Covid-19 Pandemic



Clam shells: Food to go containers. Must return to get another cafeteria meal. This is because we can't eat at the cafeteria.



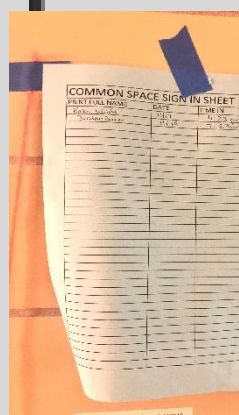
Mask collection: One for each day of the week. Must wear them everywhere except when eating, brushing teeth, showering, and in own room.



Antigen Tests: Must schedule appointment once a week. You get a call that day before 5pm if it's positive.



Thermometer: We were given these by the University & have to track our symptoms daily on an app.



Common Space Sign in Sheets: These are in showers, seating areas, & laundry rooms. One must sign these and state the time they were present to track potential Covid-19 cases.



Package Pickup: All packages get sent to Towers & one must set up an appointment to pick their package up to minimize mail crowds.



Sanitation Stations: At least 2 on every floor around campus. Usually sanitizer is provided along with a bucket of sanitation wipes.

Facilities closed: Many common areas were never open due to Covid-19 such as the fitness center and study rooms in our halls and at the library.



Spaced out facilities: Seating along with shower stalls were taped off. About half of all seating was placed in storage and the remaining had every other seat taped off. Class lecture rooms had seating allowed for every other chair as well. Granted classes were mostly online anyway so there weren't many people in class to begin with. This was due to the hybrid class format which most professors resorted to. This meant class was in person some days and online others.
