BRIAN BOWMAN

CLINICIAN AND EUPHONIUM SOLOIST

Dr. Brian L. Bowman is principal euphoniumist with the U.S. Air Force Band of Washington, D.C. Considered by his peers around the world to be the leading soloist on his instrument, many of the most important contemporary works for the euphonium have been commissioned for, commissioned by, and/or premiered by Dr. Bowman. He has been heard as a soloist in virtually every state and has presented many recitals abroad including recent appearances in Scandanavian countries and in Japan. On March 28, 1976, he presented the first full euphonium recital in the Carnegie Recital Hall in New York City.

A leading activist for the euphonium, he is a past-president of T.U.B.A., the international professional organization for euphoniumists and tubists. He has also served that organization as Euphonium Coordinator.

In addition to his many credits as a performer, Dr. Bowman is a dedicated educator. His students have won several major competitions and hold positions in the premiere military bands in Washington, D.C. A highlight of his early teaching career was his organization and direction of the first public school band in Mexico during his service as a volunteer missionary for the Church of the Latter Day Saints. He currently teaches at several colleges and universities in the Washington, D.C. area and has a busy schedule as a guest artist/clinician at universities, colleges, and high schools around the United States.

THE DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

The University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire Department of Music is acclaimed for the high quality of both its faculty and student body. The aim of the department is to graduate students who are capable of pursuing successful careers in the field of music. While expecting a high level of accomplishment, it is the department's goal to give each student every possible aid in achieving the excellence required of a successful musician.

The faculty includes artists in all performing areas of music and specialists in music education, music therapy, music literature, music history and composition. In addition, the conductor of each of the ensembles, which includes the bands, orchestras and choirs, are recognized authorities in their respective fields.

THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-EAU CLAIRE SYMPHONY BAND

Since 1968, the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire Band Program has grown to include over 200 students. The Symphony Band is a select group of the most highly qualified musicians on campus regardless of their major area of study. Repertoire is carefully selected to represent the finest in music for concert band, balancing an emphasis on contemporary literature with works drawn from preceding periods and styles. Performances by the Symphony Band have received praise from conductors William D. Revelli, Frederick Fennell, Merle Evans, and Harry Begian. Composers Norman Dello Joio, Karel Husa, Elie Seigmeister, Carlos Surinach, Vincent Persichetti, and Jim Curnow have praised the Symphony Band for its interpretation of their compositions. The Symphony Band rehearses five hours each week and presents several concerts on campus each year. In addition, the band goes on tour in the spring. The 65-piece Symphony Band is one of three concert bands at UW-EC, thus giving all instrumentalists at the University the opportunity to gain experience and enjoyment from band participation and performance.
