

EVOCATIONS: PROMISE OF SPRING is based on the poem Spring
by Richard Hovey. The poet's appeal is, "O children just born, you who have life and love to spare, travel the highway before you and seek a new day beyond the guess of any long ago. Sing new songs that you may reveal that no new sense can be in us grown old, but that we enter the lives of our fellow-men." The composer feels that the poem is a pertinent commentary on the contemporary generation.

Commenting upon the work, Norman Dello Joio has said: "The use of a young people's group seemed a fitting way to convey my own feeling in the form of a dialogue between the adult choral forces and the young. I started the composition in New York City in January and completed it at Hilton Head Island in July. EVOCATIONS is the most personal statement of my beliefs that I have done heretofore."

The present version of EVOCATIONS: PROMISE OF SPRING, for concert band and chorus is being given in a World Premiere Performance at these concerts. The band score bears the dedication:

NORMAN DELLO JOIO

Norman Dello Joio, the distinguished Pulitzer Prize-winning American composer, is descended from three generations of Italian organists. The composer was born in New York City on January 24, 1913. His musical training was begun early under his father, and he quickly showed remarkable aptitude and facility.

After three years of composition in the Juilliard Graduate School, Dello Joio proceeded to the Yale School of Music to study composition under Paul Hindemith. He was for some years on the faculty of Sarah Lawrence College and at present is Professor of Composition at the Mannes College of Music. He has composed in practically all forms: symphonic, choral, chamber, modern dance and ballet, and opera. In 1948, Mr. Dello Joio's Variations, Chaconne, and Finale, which was introduced to New York City by Bruno Walter and the New York Philharmonic, received the New York Music Critic Circle Award as the outstanding new orchestral work of that season. He won the same award in 1960 for his opera, The Triumph of St. Joan. His work for string orchestra, Meditations on Ecclesiastes, brought him the Pulitzer Prize for Music in 1957, and his score for the NBC-TV News Special on the Louvre, Scenes from the Louvre, won the 1965 Emmy Award.

Norman Dello Joio is active in many phases of music besides composition. The U.S. State Department sent him to Russia, Rumania and Bulgaria on a cultural exchange program in November, 1964. Mr. Dello Joio is also Chairman of the Policy Committee for the Contemporary Music Project, administered by the Music Educators National Conference under a grant from the Ford Foundation.

Edward Downes, the distinguished music critic, wrote in the Musical Quarterly (April, 1962): "Among established composers of serious music in this country, Norman Dello Joio is outstanding for an outgoing directness of expression and a simplicity of manner, if not always of means, which have an intentionally broad appeal. A strong melodic vein, rhythmic vitality, a relatively restrained harmonic vocabulary, an infectious brio and freshness of invention, are among the earmarks of his style. Inseparable from this style is Dello Joio's conviction, resembling almost an ethical attitude, that his music should communicate with a broad, contemporary public--not merely with an alert avant-garde, not with a few fellow composers, not with some hypothetical future public, small or large. The style in which this conviction is expressed sets Dello Joio somewhat apart from a majority of his peers."
