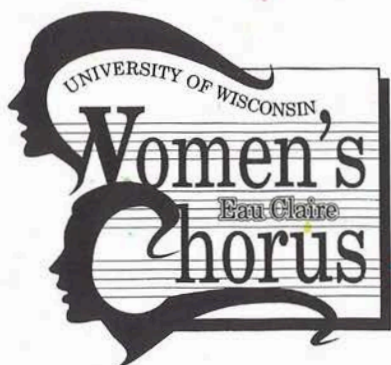

Women's Chorus

The Women's Chorus, Alan J. Rieck and Gary R. Schwartzhoff, conductors, specializes in the study and performance of music written specifically for treble ensembles. Women's Chorus is one of seven choral ensembles on the UW-Eau Claire campus, recognized as "Wisconsin's Singing University." The ensemble is comprised of female students from many scholastic disciplines within the university. Friendship in the study of literature written specifically for the uniquely beautiful sound of female voice characterizes the work of Women's Chorus.

Alan J. Rieck, Conductor

In the fall of 2001, Dr. Rieck joined the UW-Eau Claire faculty where he conducts the Women's Concert Chorale, Symphonic Choir, Women's Chorus, and teaches courses in music education. Prior to his current appointment, Dr. Rieck served as Assistant Director of Choral Studies and professor of music education at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona where he taught courses in conducting, current issues in music education, and music education teaching methods; and conducted the Men's Chorale and Women's Chorale. While in Flagstaff he also served as assistant director of the Master Chorale of Flagstaff, was the founding director of the Children's Chorale of Flagstaff, and during the 2000-2001 school year served as the NAU Director of Choral Studies. Prior to moving to Arizona, Dr. Rieck taught and conducted at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, conducted the top performing groups of the Madison Children's Choir, and served as chorus master for the Madison Symphony Orchestra Chorus. Dr. Rieck taught for six years in the public schools in West Allis, Wisconsin and is an active member of the American Choral Directors Association and Music Educators National Conference. He holds a B.M. degree in Music Education, M.M. degree in Music Education, and Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction, all from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Gary R. Schwartzhoff, Conductor

Gary R. Schwartzhoff, Associate Professor of Music, is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire where he conducts the Concert Choir, The Singing Statesmen, Chamber Choir, Women's Chorus and teaches conducting. Schwartzhoff received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Central College in Pella, Iowa and Master of Music Degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Northern Iowa, Cedar Falls, Iowa. A recipient of the Helen Kemper Doctoral Fellowship Award, he received a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Conducting at the University of Missouri in Kansas City.

Schwartzhoff has been active throughout his professional career in the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) where he served as President of North Central Division from 1992-94. Schwartzhoff has presented choirs at the state, division, and national levels of ACDA including performances at the 1984, 1996, 1998 and 2000 ADCA Divisional conventions and at the 1997 ACDA National Convention.

Schwartzhoff is the music director and conductor for The Master Singers, a community chamber ensemble with membership from throughout the Greater Chippewa Valley. He serves as Director of Music at the First Congregational Church in Eau Claire, where he conducts the Chancel Choir. Schwartzhoff has served as guest conductor and adjudicator for numerous choral festivals throughout the Midwest and Canada.

University Band

The University Band, Randal C. Dickerson, conductor, is open to all UW-Eau Claire students regardless of major. It offers students an opportunity to play quality repertoire at a high level of performance. The band is comprised of talented musicians from many academic disciplines as well as music majors, some of whom choose to perform on a secondary instrument. No auditions are required for membership in the University Band.

Randal C. Dickerson, Conductor

Dr. Randal C. Dickerson is Assistant Professor of Music Education at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, where he teaches Principles & Methods of Secondary Music Education, coordinates the student teaching program, conducts the University Band, the Women's Chorus, and the Blugold Marching Band. Before coming to Eau Claire, Dr. Dickerson spent 6 years as Assistant Dean for Undergraduate Academic Affairs and Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Illinois. There he coordinated student and curricular affairs for the School of Music, Department of Theatre, Department of Dance, and the Art Education Division. During his seven years as a high school band director in Mississippi and Washington, Dr. Dickerson's ensembles were consistently rated superior and amassed awards from many festivals in the U.S. and Canada. Dr. Dickerson is a graduate of the University of Southern Mississippi and holds a Doctor of Education (in Music Education) degree from the University of Illinois (1994).
