of the Symphony Band, received his education at Ohio Wesleyan University, the Eastman School of Music, Mannes College in New York City, and Teachers College, Columbia University. He has studied clarinet with Rufus Arey and Robert McGinnis. His teaching experience has been in the public schools of New Jersey, having been Director of Music for Midland Park, N.J., Public Schools for eleven years. He has also taught at Teachers College, Columbia University, and has been Director of Bands at the Glassboro State College Summer Fine Arts Camp. Dr. George joined the faculty of the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire i. September, 1968. At the university he is Director of University Bands and teaches clarinet and conducting. He also directs the University Clarinet Choir.

RODNEY HUDSON, ASSISTANT CONDUCTOR AND TROMBONE SOLOIST

attended undergraduate school at Minot State College, Minot, North Dakota. From 1964-67 Mr. Hudson was Band and Choir Director at public schools in North Dakota. From 1967-69 he was Director of Instrumental Music for the public schools in Brandon, Manitoba, Canada, and was also Brass Instructor at Brandon University. From 1969-71 Mr. Hudson attended graduate school at the University of Iowa where he received an M.A. and M.F.A. degree in Performance. Mr. Hudson has studied trombone with Charles Moore and John D. Hill. He was principal trombone with the Minot Symphony Orchestra and Brandon University Chamber Orchestra. In the fall of 1971, he came to the University of Wisconsin-Eau Clare as Assistant Band Director and Low Brass Instructor.

HENRY MAUTNER, TRUMPET SOLOIST

is Instructor of Trumpet and Director of the Jazz Program at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. He holds the Masters degree in performance from Yale School of Music. As a free lance trumpet player in the New York City area, he performed as solo trumpet with the New Haven Symphony, the American Concert Band, the Clem de Rosa Big Band, the New Sauter-Finnegan Band, and on national television with the Peter Duchin Orchestra at the 1976 Democtratic National Convention. In 1978 he toured through Wisconsin and Minnesota as solo trumpet with Paul Lavalle's Chamber Music Society of Lower Basin Street.

PAUL MAYBERY, TUBA SOLOIST

is a professional free lance musician in the Twin Cities and instructor of Tuba and Euphonium at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. He has performed with the Minnesota Orchestra, Shipstad and Johnson Ice Follies and the Mel Torme Orchestra. Mr. Maybery is also preparing an edition of 19th Century American Brass Band Music to be published this fall as well creating the "Great Western Band of St. Paul, Minnesota" which has performed this literature on radio and television. He has this past year co-organized the Czech Chamber Music Festival. He has taught public school in New Jersey and Wisconsin for six years prior to coming to Eau Claire. Beginning this fall he will also be on the faculty of Macalester Ccllege.
