

THE BLUGOLD BAND

Narrator: begin reading the "Introduction" and "Fanfare and Entrance" after the band is in entrance formation on the sidelines and the director appears in front. Anticipate the maneuvers with related commentary during bell interludes or the given cues.

INTRODUCTION

"Good evening football fans of Wisconsin State College. This is Ray Urbas bringing you a description of the half-time pageantry for tonight's game. You will now be entertained by the Blugold Band in a fast-stepping, marching, playing, and singing gridiron show. The director of the college band is Dr. Leo Christy. Chuck Mehls is the drum major, and the baton twirlers are Rosie Wanner and Mary Lee.

FANFARE AND ENTRANCE

"The Blugold Band is now in its entrance formation and begins our ^{pageant} gridiron show with a brilliant fanfare and march across the field to the music of "Marching Along Together."

HOOP FORMATION (Read immediately after the band shouts Hi.)

"The current craze is hoops, so the band appropriately forms two spinning hoops and features our baton twirlers. The tune, of course, is "Hoop-De-Doo."

DAD'S SALUTE (Read immediately after hoop music stops and band forms rectangle)

"Tonight is Dad's Day for the home team, so the band now forms a dollar sign for the breadwinner, Dad, and salutes him with the tune, "My Hero."

(Immediately after \$ sign is formed and the music stops----)

"To make their tribute to Dad complete, the band now sings, "Our Dads". Let's listen to it."

MOM'S SALUTE (Read during bells interlude while band forms a heart.)

"Mom, the homemaker, cannot be overlooked on this occasion, so the band forms a heart and serenades her also with "I Want a Girl."

SALUTE TO STOUT (Read during bells interlude while band forms an S)

"The band now salutes the Stout College fans with the letter "S" and their school song."

EAU CLAIRE SALUTE (Read during bells interlude while S changes to E)

"The band now forms an "E" for the Blugold fans and plays the college "Fight Song."

EXIT (Read as band leaves field.)

"Drum Major Chuck Mehls now leads the Marching Blugolds off the field."
"Let's give the band in appreciation of their show."
