ABOUT THE GUEST ARTISTS

DAVID VAN de BOGART, Associate Professor of Flute, joined the staff at the School of Music, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, in 1973. During that time he has established a large and nationally competitive flute studio. The outstanding quality and talent of his students brought into existence the UNL FLUTE CHOIR in 1977. The choir since has gained national recognition for its performances and new music commissioned by and dedicated to the UNL FLUTE CHOIR. He has appeared throughout the East Coast, Nebraska, and the Mid-West as guest soloist, clinician, adjudicator, and conductor.

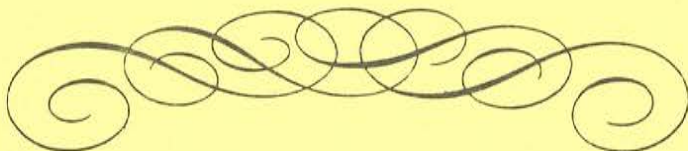
A native of Cortland, New York, he attended Ithaca College and the Julliard School of Music. His professional background includes study with Julius Baker, David Berman, Shaul Ben-Meir, Betty Bang Mather, Roger Mather, and William Bennett.

In addition to his teaching at the University and in his private studio, Professor Van de Bogart is an active performer as principal flutist with the Lincoln Symphony Orchestra, Nebraska Chamber Orchestra, Nebraska Woodwind Quintet, and with various solo/chamber recitals.

Professor Van de Bogart was the 1981 recipient of the University of Nebraska's Annis Chaikin Sorensen Award for Distinguished Teaching in the Humanities. He is called a teacher of total dedication. One of his students said, "Professor Van de Bogart has a deep love and respect for the art of music, and he strives to develop a love of learning within his students."

BECKY VAN de BOGART, is a native of New Mexico who has lived in Nebraska teaching and playing professionally for the past nine years. She holds the piccolo desk with the Lincoln Symphony Orchestra, principal flute with the UNL Summer Opera, and performs with various other Chamber groups. Her graduate work in performance was done at UNL where she studied with her husband, David Van de Bogart. During the summers, Mrs. Van de Bogart has studied with many famous flutists including Julius Baker, Marcel Moyse, James Pellerite and Jan Gippo.

Mrs. Van de Bogart's teaching experience includes students of all ages. While at UNL she held the Graduate Assistantship, teaching flute majors and minors. In Omaha she taught a successful flute studio for three years and has done the same in Lincoln since 1974. Beginning in September of 1979, she has participated in the Lincoln Symphony Association's Young People's Demonstrations, preparing elementary age children for the Lincoln Symphony's Youth Concerts.
