The University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire is one of the fastest growing institutions of higher education in the state. The University presently ranks third in size in the University of Wisconsin system with an enrollment of 9800 students. The Department of Music offers degrees in music education, liberal arts, performance, and music therapy. There are over five hundred music majors and minors in the department.

The University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire Jazz program has been referred to by Charles Suber of Downbeat magazine as a national success story. The jazz program includes four jazz ensembles, six organized combos, jazz history and jazz improvization lessons. The Eighth Annual Jazz Festival presented last year drew 45 high school and 18 college bands and 17 combos from a five-state area. This year's festival will be held on April 2 and 3.

- -Brass Choir performance with the Minnesota Orchestra, December 5 and 6, 1973.
- -Premiere performance with the Minnesota Orchestra of Robert Beadells "Improvisation and Dance" for Jazz Band and Orchestra, May 23 and 24, 1974, Minneapolis, Minnesota
- -Performance of Phil Wilson's "The Earth's Children" with the Minnesota Youth Orchestra, at Northrop Hall, 1975.

DOMINIC SPERA, THE DIRECTOR

Mr. Spera's contributions to music have gained him wide recognition in the jazz curriculum area as well as the performing arts. He has taught privately and in school systems for over twenty years and holds a B.M.E. and M.M.E. from Indiana University. Prior teaching credits include work as a band director in New York schools, and for Indiana University, the University Junior and Senior High and Jazz Ensemble II.

His professional background includes prolific work as a composer-arranger and performances as a jazz artist. For nine years, Mr. Spera performed professionally in New York with the City Center Ballet Orchestra, the Radio City Symphony and in various Broadway musicals for the David Merrick Office. Most recently he has played lead trumpet for Burt Bacharach, Petula Clark, Johnny Mathis, Andy Williams, Henry Mancini and a host of other entertainment luminaries.

Since 1968, Mr. Spera has been associated with the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, teaching trumpet, brass choir, Jazz Ensemble, Brass Techniques and Jazz Improvisation. He is extremely active as a director/clinician with the Shell Lake (Wisc.) Stage Band Camp and the National Summer Jazz Camps.

Mr. Spera has been very active as clinician/soloist having performed the Haydn trumpet concerto at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago in December, 1975. He is also an author and composer for the Hal Leonard Publishing Company.
