OPENING FANFARE

Band takes entrance formation at the South center sidelines, and begins its football pageantry with a brilliant, modern fanfare composed by Howard Brubeck.

THE ENTRY

Band marches to the center of the field to the strains of "Marching Along Together."

HI FORMATION

Band greets the visitors by forming "Hi".

The "HI" formation reverses position to greet the River Falls fans.

TEACHERS' SALUTE

For the visiting teachers, the band forms an outline of a schoolhouse and plays a swing version of "School Days."

GOOD LUCK FORMATION

For a good luck omen to their team, the band forms a horseshoe and plays the popular tune "Lucky Day."

THREE-IN-ONE FORMATION

The band regroups in centerfield to present a "three-in-one" marching and playing routine.

Playing the "American Red Cross March," the band first rotates its formation to face the visitors stands.

The block formation changes into a rectangle.

The rectangle changes into the letter "R" to salute the River Falls fans. The letter "R" changes into a letter "E" to salute the Eau Claire fans. The band plays the Eau Claire college "Alma Mater" and the audience joins in the singing.

EXIT

Drum major Chuck Mehls marches the Blugold band off to the sidelines.
