Bill Evans came to public light with Miles Davis's return to recording and performing in 1981, and from that point on Mr. Evans recorded on the next four Miles albums (The Man With The Horn through Decoy). Introduced to Miles by Miles' former saxophonist Daye Liebman, Mr. Evans became a valuable member of the Miles Davis band as multiple reed player and pianist. In an interview by <u>Musician</u> magazine, Mr. Davis referred to Bill Evans as one of the greatest musicians he has ever encountered. His talents in the music profession extend beyond that of performer. Mr. Evans is not only

very active in writing and arranging his own compositions, he has also produced his own albums; Living On The Crest Of A Wave, (Elektra Musician), and The Alternative Man on the Blue Note label. In 1984, when John McLaughlin resurrected his Mahavishnu Orchestra, Bill Evans was to play with the band as McLaughlin's first reed player in the history of the group. After recording Primitive Cool for rock superstar Mick Jagger in 1986, Mr. Evans has spent much of 87-88 playing and recording with Michael Franks and Gil Evans. Other illuminaries that Mr. Evans has played with include; John Scofield, Sonny Rollins, Billy Idol, Gary Burton, Spyro Gyra, and the Brecker Brothers. Most currently Mr. Evans is the saxophonist for Herbie Hancock.

Brian Torff is an outstanding performing bassist and composer. Mr. Torff is also a frequent guest artist with the Tonight Show Orchestra. As a recording artist Mr. Torff has recorded with Pianist George Shearing on the Lp Blues Alley and has a solo album entitled Hitchhiker of Karoo. A testimony to the versitily of Mr. Torff's writing ability is the wide spectrum of musical mediums he has written for. He has composed for jazz ensembles and small groups; in addition many of his compositions have been orchestrated and have been performed by orchestras such as the Boston Pops as well as the L.A. Philharmonic Orchestra. Currently Mr. Torff resides at the University of Connecticut, Bridgeport as director of Jazz Studies.

Matt Narris, residing in Los Angeles, displays his many talents in the music business by composing, arranging, performing and teaching. Mr. Harris' debut album, Mit and Run, soon to be released by Voss Records features his compositions and keyboard playing as well as his producing ability. After graduating out of the Eastman School of Music, Mr. Harris joined the Maynard Ferguson Orchestra as keyboardist and composer for the band. Three of his tunes, Mira, Mira, The Last Dive, and M.O.T. were recorded on Maynard's Body and Soul album (Black Hawk BKH 50101). While Mr. Harris was the pianist with the Buddy Rich Band, he had the opportunity to perform with such notable musicians as Sammy Davis Jr., Dizzy Gillespie, Milt Jackson, Jon Hendricks and Joe Williams. Mr. Harris can also be heard on Doc Severinsen's latest album, Facets. Mr. Harris' more commercial efforts yield an impressive list of work for television shows such as Dallas, Knots Landing, A-Team, Hunter, Murder She Wrote, and Our House. Mr. Harris' reputation as a Jazz composer and arranger is widely acclaimed in the Jazz education field. His big band and small group charts published by Kendor Music have received critical acclaim in several jazza education magazines. Currently Mr. Harris is teaching at California State University, Northridge.

Robert Curnow is currently the President of the International Association of Jazz Educators. Mr. Curnow was a trombonist and arranger for the Stan Kenton Orchestra in the mid to late 60's and 70's. Mr. Curnow also produced albums for Stan Kenton's Creative World Records in 1972-76. Curnow's arrangements and compositions can be heard on six Kenton albums. Mr. Curnow also directed the McDonald's All-American High School Jazz Band for eight years. As Director of Bands and Jazz Studies at California State University in Los Angeles from 1976-87 he was also responsible for establishing a highly esteemed award-winning Jazz Ensemble. Mr. Curnow is widely recorded and published as a composer/arranger for jazz ensemble, and is the owner and President of Sierra Music Publications, which is located in Liberty Lake, Washington. Mr. Curnow has been an active guest conductor of symphony orchestras (Boston Pops, Cleveland Philharmonic, Florida Symphony, Shreveport Symphony etc.) Mr. Curnow has also conducted many All-State Jazz Ensembles throughout the United States. He is also the founder and musical director of the new Spokane Jazz Repertory Orchestra.
