TUBA FORMATION (read during the bells interlude)

"The foundation of the band is, of course, the impressive looking sousaphone. What cound be more appropriate for our deep-voiced (friends than 'Asleep in the Deep'."

BELL LYRA FORMATION (read during the bells interlude)

"The bell lyra design often represents a symbol of music. Today we are pleased to present our star bell player in a familiar but difficult piece of her own choosing."
