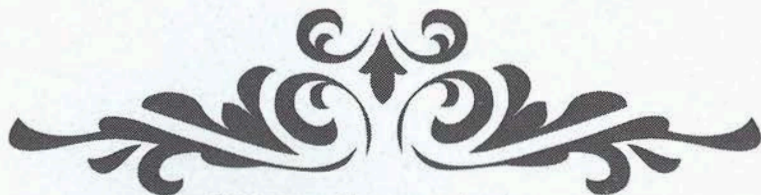



Jeffery Crowell, Guest Artist

Assistant Professor of Music, Dr. Jeffery Crowell, teaches applied percussion and percussion techniques, and conducts the various Percussion Ensembles and Jazz Ensemble III. He is active throughout the Midwest and Western United States as a performer, clinician, adjudicator, and educator and is on the teaching staff at the Yamaha Sounds of Summer-Midwest Total Percussion Camp in Illinois. He has performed with and for such artists as Bobby Shew, Louie Bellson, Lou Harrison, Kent Nagano, Joan Rivers, and Henry Mancini. He has performed at the Los Angeles Philharmonic's Green Umbrella Series, in the motion picture "The Majestic" starring Jim Carrey, marched with the Velvet Knights Drum and Bugle Corps, and has taught on the staffs of numerous award-winning groups including the Tournament of Roses Marching Honor Band. Dr. Crowell endorses Sabian Cymbals and Vic Firth Sticks and Mallets.

Richard Mark Heidel, Conductor

Richard Mark Heidel is Director of Bands and Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. His duties include conducting the Wind Symphony, teaching courses in conducting, supervising student teachers, and overseeing the university band program. A native of Texas, he holds the Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music in Conducting from Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas as well as the Doctor of Education in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Prior to his appointment to the UW-Eau Claire faculty, Dr. Heidel served as Director of Bands at Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania for three years. From 1995-1997, he was a teaching assistant in the School of Music at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. In addition to his university teaching experiences, Dr. Heidel was a high school band director in Texas for nine years.

Rodney B. Hudson, Conductor

Rodney B. Hudson is Associate Professor of Music at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire where he teaches Applied Trombone, Brass Methods/Techniques, and conducts the Symphony Band, Brass Choir, and Trombone Choir. Mr. Hudson serves on the faculty of the International Music Camp located on the border between North Dakota and the province of Manitoba. He has also served on the faculty at the Indianhead

Fine Arts Camp in Shell Lake, Wisconsin. Mr. Hudson received his Bachelor in Science in Music Education from Minot State University where he studied trombone with Dr. Charles Moore. He holds a Master of Arts and a Master of Fine Arts from the University of Iowa where he studied trombone under Dr. John D. Hill. Prior to his appointment at UW-Eau Claire, Mr. Hudson taught choral and instrumental music in the public schools of North Dakota and served as principal trombone of the Minot Symphony Orchestra. He also served as Instrumental Music Coordinator and Conductor in the public school system in Brandon, Manitoba.

UW-Eau Claire Department of Music and Theatre Arts

Located along the banks of the Chippewa River, the beautiful UW-Eau Claire campus houses a student population of approximately 10,000 and has over 700 faculty members. The Department of Music and Theatre Arts averages over 400 majors and minors.
