Jack Herrick, Guest Artist

Jack Herrick is professor of music at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley. His teachers include Christopher Leuba, Charles Kavalovski, Dale Clevenger, and James Miller. He has performed with the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Colorado Springs Symphony, Central City Opera, Colorado Symphony, Opera Colorado, and the Western Opera Theatre. For fourteen seasons he served as principal hornist with the Colorado Ballet and Denver Chamber Orchestra (Chamber Orchestra of the West). He appeared as soloist with the DCO on ten occasions. He is a former member of both the Rocky Mountain and Aries Brass Quintets in Colorado. Presently he is a member of the Denver Brass, one of the few professional symphonic brass groups in America.

During the past twenty-eight years Mr. Herrick has performed as a hornist with the Peter Britt Festival Orchestra in Jacksonville, Oregon, serving as principal for the past twenty seasons. He has appeared as a soloist with all the music directors of the Britt Festival. Beside his performances at Britt, his summer schedule has included the Colorado, Idaho, Sun Valley Music Festivals, and the Four Corners Opera Associations. From 1990-1994 he served as a horn instructor for the International Music Camp held at the Peace Gardens on the border between North Dakota and Manitoba. He remains active as soloist, chamber musician, and artist/clinician for the Yamaha Corporation.

Since coming to UNC in 1973, Mr. Herrick made the first recording of the David Amram Concerto for Horn and Wind Orchestra with the UNC Wind Ensemble, and he has performed as soloist with all the major performing ensembles on campus.

Richard Mark Heidel

Richard Mark Heidel is Director of Bands and Assistant Professor of Music in the Department of Music and Theatre Arts at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. His duties include conducting the Wind Symphony, teaching courses in conducting, and overseeing the university band program. A native of Texas, he holds the Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music in Conducting from Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas as well as the Doctor of Education in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Prior to his appointment to the UW-Eau Claire faculty, Dr. Heidel served as Director of Bands at Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania for three years. From 1995-1997, he was a teaching assistant in the School of Music at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. In addition to his university teaching experiences, Heidel was a high school

band director in Texas for nine years. He has been distinguished with memberships in numerous national and international honor societies and fraternities including Pi Kappa Lambda, Kappa Kappa Psi, Phi Eta Sigma, Phi Kappa Phi, Kappa Delta Pi, Pi Nu Epsilon, and Golden Key. He was also the recipient of the "Outstanding Musician" award at Texas Tech University in both 1985 and 1986, and was named to the Outstanding Young Men of America in 1989. In 1997, he received the A.A. Harding Award at the University of Illinois for the "highest possible achievement, service, and devotion to the University Bands."

Dr. Heidel maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician, arranger, adjudicator, drill designer, and trumpet performer. Dr. Heidel holds professional memberships in the College Band Directors National Association, National Band Association, Music Educators National Conference, and the Wisconsin Music Educators Association.

Rodney Hudson

Mr. Hudson is Associate Professor of Music at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire where he teaches applied trombone and brass techniques, and conducts the Symphony Band, Brass Choir, and Trombone Ensemble. During the summer Mr. Hudson serves as trombone instructor at the International Music Camp located on the border between North Dakota and Manitoba and the Indianhead Fine Arts Camp at Shell Lake, Wisconsin.

He is active as a recitalist-clinician and performs with the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire Faculty Brass Quintet, and is principal trombone for the Chippewa Valley Symphony during the academic year. He is a member of the International Brass Quintet at the International Music Camp during the summer term. He has also performed with the Bobby Vinton Orchestra, Jimmy Dorsey Orchestra and the Frequency Band under the leadership of Norman Bolter of the Boston Symphony.

Mr. Hudson received a BS degree in music education from Minot State University, where he studied trombone with Charles Moore. He holds MA and MFA degrees in performance from the University of Iowa, where he studied trombone with John D. Hill.

Prior to his appointment at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, Mr. Hudson taught in the public schools in North Dakota and served as instrumental coordinator and conductor in the public school system in Brandon, Manitoba. He also served as brass instructor in the Conservatory of Music at Brandon University. Mr. Hudson served as principal trombonist with the Minot Symphony Orchestra, University of Iowa Symphony Orchestra and the Brandon University Chamber Orchestra.
