Deo Gracias Recession

A precious musician, Benjamin Britten (b.1913) is best known for his instrumental works and operas, especially Peter Grimes (1945), which brought to him international fame and a preeminent position among English composers. A Ceremony of Carols was composed after the pacifist Britten's return to war-torn England in 1942. Written for the Fleet Street Choir of Norwich Castle, England, it is a set of nine carols for treble voices and harp with a latin processional/recessional and a harp interlude. The predominantly medieval texts are woven together with a mixture of sophisticated ingenuity and simplicity of effect to create a warmth and lightheartedness especially appropriate for the Christmas season.
